Key Knowledge

- We can draw or paint objects in **proportion** to each other.
- We need to think about the **space, position** and **features** of an object to draw it **accurately**.
- To know that different lines can be used to create an effect.
- To know what texture is and how different textures can be described.
- To know which colours to mix together to create a desired effect.
- Yellow + red = orange
- Blue + yellow = green
- Blue + yellow + red = brown

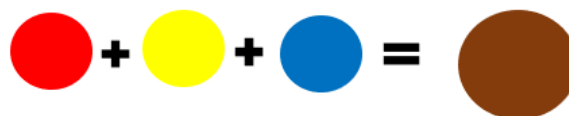
Key Vocabulary and definitions

Proportion	Proportion in art is the relationship between the sizes of different parts of a picture or an object.
Space	Space in art is the area that an object takes up, or the area around the object.
Position	Where and how something has been placed.
Features	The details on a picture or object.
Texture	How something feels or looks like it will feel eg. rough, smooth, bumpy, soft.
Stripes	Lines that are side by side.
Spots	A small round(ish) mark.
Henri Rousseau	A famous French painter. He painted the picture called 'Tiger in a tropical storm'.

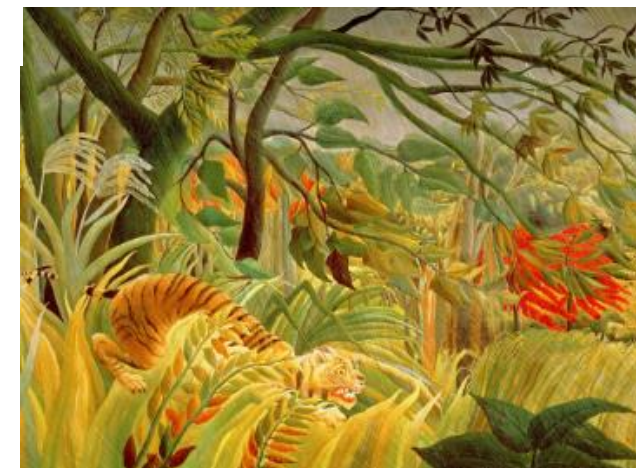
Animal patterns
