Key Knowledge

- A designer is a person who plans what is going to be made and how it will be made.
- When creating a product you can use these three steps design, make and evaluate.
- Divas are usually made from a material called clay.
- To make divas you will use different techniques like rolling and pinching to mould your clay.
- The **well** in the middle of the Diva that is created by using your thumb should be large enough to fit a small **candle**.
- When wet clay can become **soft**, but it becomes hard when it is **dry**.
