Weekly Update

Reading

Reading is a key life skill and is placed at the heart of our curriculum. Research shows that children's future academic and job prospects are directly related to their reading proficiency. To support children in reading we suggest that children read regularly at home as well as in school. We suggest reading at home with your child at least four times a week and to log this in their reading record with a comment on their reading. You could comment on at least one of the following each time you hear your child read:

Phonics – Were they able to blend the sounds together to read the words? Were there any particular sounds they needed help with.

Common Exception words/ Sight words – Words that are tricky to sound out. You could list some of the words your child read without sounding out.

Fluency - Is the reading fluent and is your child beginning to use expression in their reading?

Understanding – Ask your child to retell the story in their own words and comment on whether they could retell the main parts of the story. Could your child answer the questions in the back of the book?
